Conduct of Scrutineers

A candidate may appoint scrutineers to represent him/her during voting. Candidates may appoint one scrutineer for each ballot box in a voting location. The number of scrutineers who may be present is reduced by one while the candidate who appointed them is present in the voting location.

Scrutineer Requirements

Before a scrutineer can observe the voting process they must:

- provide written proof of his/her appointment to the Location Manager
- take the Oath of Secrecy with the Location Manager

Permitted Actions

- enter the voting location 15 minutes before it opens to view ballots, all election documents (but not so as to delay the timely opening of the voting location)
- place his/her own seal on the ballot box before the opening of the voting location AND again after the close of voting
- object to a voter they believe is not qualified to vote
- during slow periods, ask a DRO whether a voter has voted
- sign the results tape produced after the close of polls

Prohibited Actions

- Interfere with or disrupt the voting process
- Speak with electors
- Campaign in the Polling Location or display campaign material (buttons, flyers)
- Remove the Voters' List from the DRO's table
- Be near enough to the Vote Tabulator to see how a person has marked their ballot.
- Use cell phones, cameras, recording devices or other communication devices.
